What Is Being Done?

The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) will be resurfacing 3.3 miles of M-29, upgrading sidewalk curb ramps, performing curb and gutter repairs, and restriping permanent pavement markings in the city of New Baltimore and Chesterfield Township. Work will also include patching and restriping permanent pavement markings on Main Street.

When Will This Be Done?

Work begins in July and is expected to be finished in November 2025.

How Will Traffic Be Affected?

Motorists should expect single-lane closures from Baker Road to the Macomb/St. Clair county line.

M-29 will be closed one direction at a time for up to two weeks between Main Street/Huntley Avenue and Murdick Drive. Only one lane will be open on westbound M-29, with eastbound traffic detoured via Main Street. Later in the project, only one lane will be open on eastbound M-29, with westbound traffic detoured via Main Street.

Business and pedestrian access will be maintained throughout the project.

Long-term Benefits

This project will extend the life of the roadway and improve the ride quality and safety of the M-29 corridor.
